WHAT FAITH IS AND WHAT FAITH IS NOT - Dr. Timothy Hawkins

"Truly I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be taken up and thrown into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will come to pass, it will be done for him."

(Mark 11:23)

The word "faith" is a Christian buzzword that everybody uses, but few can explain what it really means. And to be honest, there are many Christians who secretly feel that they don't have enough faith. To put your fears at rest, let's discuss what faith is and what it is not.

What Faith Is Not

Faith is not trying to demand that God do something for you. If you are trying to make God do something for you, that means you believe He has not done it. It also implies that you think you know your

situation better than God knows it. Faith begins where the will of God is known. And the will of God is known through his Word. If you don't know God's will in a situation, then you cannot believe that God will help you.

The Word of God tells us that all the promises of God belong to us through Christ. It also tells us that all things that pertain unto life and godliness have been given unto us. This all happened when Jesus was hanging on the cross. He spoke these powerful words: IT IS FINISHED.

What was finished? The plan of redemption for the human race was carried out through the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Everything that Adam lost in the Garden of Eden was given back to us through Jesus! You can only believe for the things God has already provided. Faith looks back at the cross and realizes all the promises God has made to us have belonged to us since that time. We can lay claim to them in faith. Faith is not trying to get God to do something for you – because God has already, through Christ, provided all things for you.

But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:19 (KJV) (Continued Page 2)

Many people say things like "God is going to heal me one day," or "... meet my financial need one day," but God is not going to do it "one day." God has already met your needs through Christ about two thousand years ago. His promises will never be a reality in your life unless you reach out in faith and accept them as fact. My faith is the fact that all is well in my life.

What Faith Actually Is

Now that we've discussed what faith is not, we must clarify what faith actually is. Faith is defined as "belief with strong conviction; firm belief in something for which there may be no tangible proof; complete trust, confidence, reliance, or devotion." Faith is the opposite of doubt. Hebrews 11:1-6 describes faith in great detail. Verse number one provides a short definition of faith by stating that faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. After giving examples of the faith of key characters in the Bible, Hebrews 11 tells us that without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

So what do we hope for? We hope that the God we believe in is trustworthy and honors His promises to us. God is not a man that He should lie (Numbers 23:19). There has never been a time that God has deceived man and gone back on His word. The second part of Hebrews definition of faith is something that we all struggle with: believing in something that does not exist in the physical, sensory, perceptive world that we live in. But what we believe in does ex-

ist in the realm of the spirit and according to the kingdom principle. Eternal life, which begins with our individual salvation here on Earth, is also something we do not see, but our faith in God makes us certain of these things. Again, we don't count on scientific, tangible proof but on the absolute reliability of God's character and integrity.

For those that feel that they don't have enough faith, don't fear. We can't create faith on our own, but God provides believers with the faith needed to believe in Him and His promises. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, For it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith — and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast (NIV).

Martin Luther, an early Christian reformer, said it best: "Ask God to work faith in you, or you will remain forever without faith, no matter what you wish, say or can do." Yea and Amen.

Divorce Is Not An Option - First Lady Rachel Hawkins

the not-so-distant past, the subject of divorce was unmen-Couples tionable. stayed together, even if they were unhappy. In our culture today, though, many see divorce as a positive solution to a troubled situation. However, as Harvard sociologist Armand Nicholi III

concluded, "Divorce is not a solution, but an exchange of problems." And usually, the problems are doubled.

The reason why divorce is so heart-wrenching is because it goes against God's original plan for marriage. Genesis 2:24 states, Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh. Marriage between a God-fearing man and a God-fearing woman is beautiful to see. This is the biblical definition of marriage: one man, one woman, both created in His image, permanently joined to one another. God declared such union blessed.

John MacArthur reminds us that God did not create a multitude of people all at once. He created one person of each gender and instructed them to fill the earth with their offspring. With that, He established marriage as an institution. And nothing other than monogamous heterosexual marriage was even possible!

When pastor and I prepare couples for marriage, we let them know that divorce is not an option. We also ask each couple in the first session, "Did God tell you to marry him or her?" The answers vary:

some couples answer right away while some couples are hesitant. In order to really answer that question, you must be 1) true to God, 2) true to yourself, and 3) true to your partner. Without the soul-searching truth to this question, your marriage can end in divorce. If you can answer in truth that God has told you marry this person, that will be the very thread that holds you both together: because God said it.

Now, if you married without asking or answering the question, please don't use this information as an excuse to depart from your spouse. You have to rightly divide the word of truth. As Jesus said, "What therefore God has joined together, let not man put asunder" (Mark 10:9). "Asunder" is another word for "separate." God can and will heal your marriage by keeping the union together. But you must bring your marriage and your marital struggles before God. Acknowledge God in all your ways and He will direct your paths (see Proverbs 3:6).

"The man who hates and divorces his wife," says the LORD, the God of Israel, "does violence to the one he should protect," says the LORD Almighty (Malachi 2:16, NIV). Let's think about that phrase "does violence." If marriage means that you and your spouse are "one flesh," then divorce means a tearing apart, an amputation if you will. In fact, according to the Hebrew definition, the word divorce actually means to cut or to tear a limb from the body.

Just as amputees experience phantom pains, so too do divorced people. The only difference is that the

phantom pain that comes from divorce affects not only you, but your family and friends. And that pain will last throughout your life.

God hates a lying and prideful spirit. That kind of spirit can be a huge contributor to the demise of a marriage. A lying spirit, undoubtedly influenced by the whispers of the Devil, convinces a person that he or she would be happier being divorced. It's never his or her fault, it's always the spouse who has the problem. "The kids will adjust," they say, trying to justify their decision. All of these justifications are lies. And where there is lying and false pride, there is actually fear and insecurity — the result of not trusting God. But without faith it is impossible to please [God] (Hebrews 11:6).

God loves us with a love that we cannot even imagine, and that is another reason why He hates divorce. Marriage is holy and not to be entered into lightly. God created marriage; He did not create divorce. Man did that, due to the hardness of our hearts (see Matthew 19:8). God knows that even the most amicable of divorces is not without pain. God's desire for us is that we have life and have it more abundantly (see John 10:10).

Therefore, when you go into a relationship, realize that every date is a potential mate. Be cautious in whom you choose as your spouse, because your marriage should exalt God and glorify Him in a world that needs to see who He is. We are created in the image of God: people who wouldn't otherwise know Him should be able to see God in us and through our commitment to our spouses. Our marital commitment and loving relationship mimics the devotion God gives to us, His people, and the love we give back to God through worshiping him.

To those who are already married, are you glorifying God in the way you treat your spouse, or are you thinking the grass is greener on the other side? I assure you, it's not! Proverbs 5:18 says, rejoice in the wife of your youth (NIV). There is such a comfort in focusing on the one you made a vow to, in remaining faithful, in being there for your spouse in good times and bad, in sickness and in health — in other words, in doing life together. Whenever you think you can't make it, go to God, ask Him to help you, and He will see you through! Divorce is not an option: God is the only option!

Grapefruit & Thyme Lemonade



Ingredients:

1 cup of Water
1 cup of Sugar
8 stems of Thyme
4 Grapefruits Juiced
1 cup Lemon Juice
4 cups Cold Water

Directions:

- Combine 1 cup of water and the sugar in a sauce pan with 8 stems of thyme to make a simple syrup.
- Bring the simple syrup to a boil. Once a boil reach let it continue to boil for 1 to 2 minutes. Then remove from the heat.
- Add 4 cups of cold water to a pitcher.
- Remove the stems of thyme and pour your simple syrup into the pitcher with the water.
- Add in 1 cup of lemon juice and the juice of 4 grapefruits.
- Stir until combined and then refrigerate until cold. Then enjoy!



Coloring Activity – For All Ages



Conquer Cravings with These Healthy Substitutions

We have all experienced food cravings – and often those cravings have to do with texture – like something creamy or crunchy. Food textures play a big role in whether we like or dislike certain foods. For example, while you may not like mushy canned peas, you may be surprised that you like fresh or barely cooked peas.

Luckily, eating healthy includes foods of all sorts of textures and flavors. Here are some suggestions on satisfying your cravings with nutritious snacks of a variety of textures:

Creamy

Instead of this: While ice cream may come to mind first, there are a variety of other smooth snacks that can be just as satisfying. Try munching on this:

- Fresh avocado spread on whole grain bread OR
 1/2 avocado eaten plain with a spoon.
- Warm 1 tablespoon creamy peanut butter in the microwave for 10 seconds and drizzle over ½ cup low-fat, no added sugar frozen yogurt.
- Puree some berries and swirl into a cup of low-fat yogurt with no sugar added.

Crunchy

Instead of this: Pretzels and chips have a crunchy texture that you may crave, but they can come with a lot of extra sodium that you don't need. Try munching on this:

- ♦ ¾ cup whole grain cereal, no added sugar
- Crunchy unsalted nuts
- Whole grain crisp breads
- Plain popcorn; to add some flavor, experiment with various spices like cinnamon or your favorite spice or herb.

Liquid

Instead of this: Sweet tea or soda may sound refreshing, but it can take a while to work off all those empty calories. A medium-sized fancy mocha coffee drink with whipped cream can be 400 calories- and that's before adding sugar or honey. Try sipping on this:

 Plain iced tea made with a squeeze of lemon. You can sweeten with berries or a non-caloric sweetener

- Add fruit slices to a glass and fill with club soda
- Instead of the fancy mocha drink, choose a small latte made with nonfat milk and topped with cinnamon which is about a quarter of the calories.

Squishy

Instead of this: Jelly-like candies or even kids' "fruit" snacks might sound like squishy fun in your mouth, but other options pack more nutrition. Try munching on this:

- Fresh grapes are sweet and juicy; freeze them for a few minutes for a fun texture
- Make tapioca pudding with squishy tapioca pearls; follow the directions on the box, only use half the amount of sugar or a non-caloric sweetener and fat-free or low-fat (1%) milk
- Cherry tomatoes and room-temperature string cheese are squishy, stringy fun.

Crispy

Instead of this: Some folks may not like apples because they can be soft and mealy or grainy; the same can be true of over-cooked potatoes. Try munching on this:

- Choose crisp apple varieties like: Braeburn, Honey Crisp, Fuji and Gala; avoid Cortland, Red Delicious or Rome which can be softer
- Choose red potatoes or white potatoes and don't overcook; avoid Russet potatoes which are high in starch making them perfect for mashed potatoes – but also making them seem 'mealy or grainy'


